Establishment of a European Interest Group targeting Japan

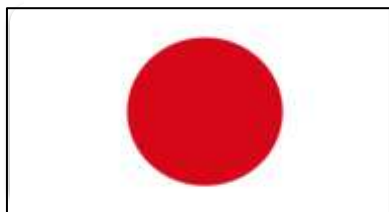
- First call launched on Food Crops and Biomass Production Technologies, now open

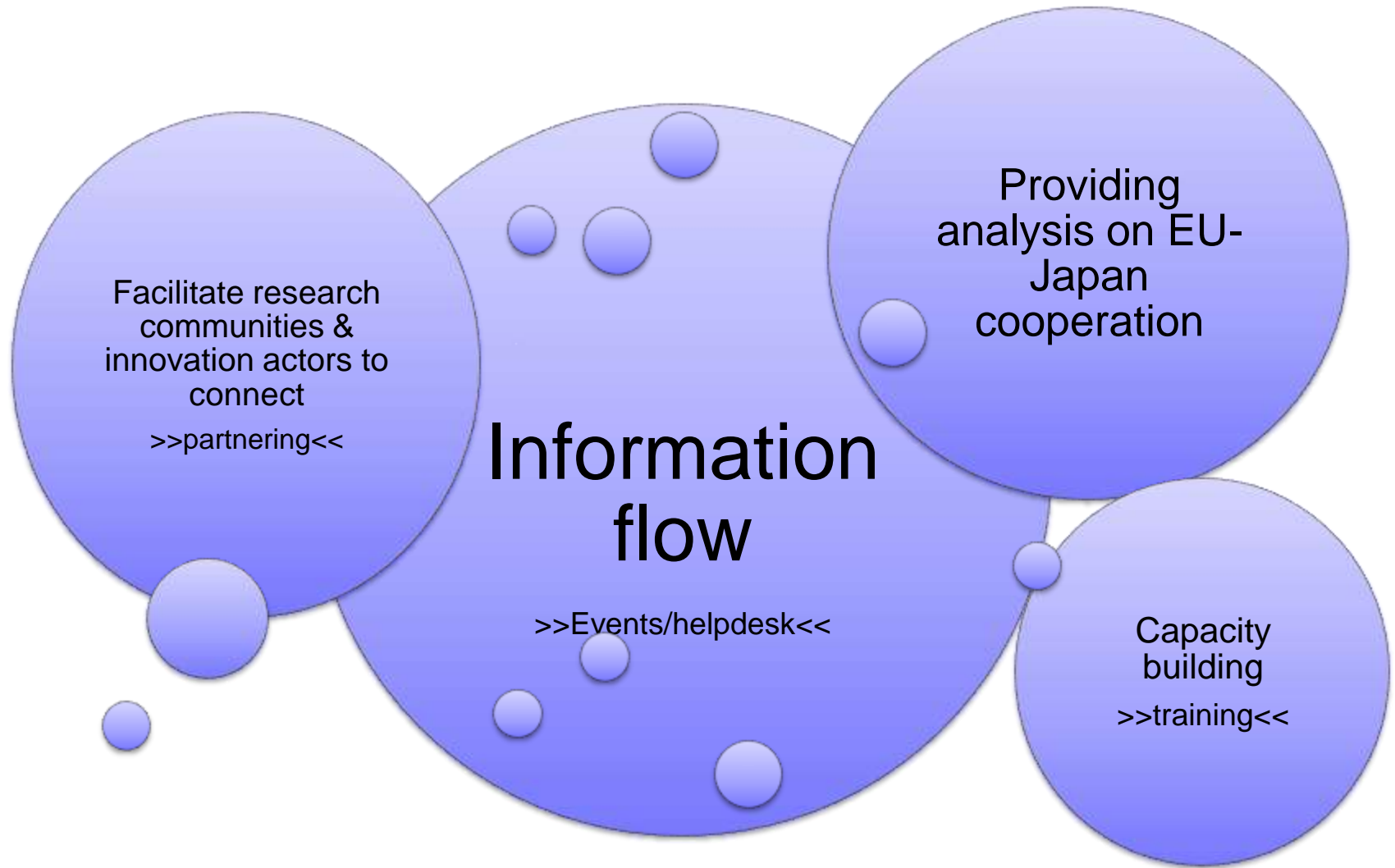
